Our History

In June of 2018 conversations began between leaders from Grace Hills Church and State College Christian Church. We were like-minded churches in similar situations with a strong spiritual affinity. After many discussions and prayer among elders, ministry leaders and the entirety of both congregations, we recognized what appeared to be a wide-open door for obeying Jesus' prayer for unity among His followers in a very practical and meaningful way. Throughout the exploration of a potential merger of the two churches, the consensus was, "if it's God's will, we want it." It soon became clear that God was leading us in that direction. Having gained confidence in God's apparent will for our churches, the decision to merge into Grays Woods Church was made on October 17, 2018.

Our Mission

Grays Woods Church is a Christ-centered community whose mission is to *love all in truth*, partner in the Gospel, and grow in Christ. Everything we do revolves around our vision to pursue authentic love, faithful service, and spiritual growth. We recognize this is our motivation in serving and sharing Jesus Christ. GRAYS WOODS/PATTON TOWNSHIP


The community of Grays Woods has been in development for nearly 30 years. To date 556 single-family and multi-family homes have been built, with a total of 1,800 residential units planned within five neighborhood areas that include Graysdale, Marywood, Brynwood, Deerbrook, and Grays Pointe. The population of Patton Township, according to the latest census (2022) is 15,829.

STATE COLLEGE/PENN STATE UNIVERSITY

The Borough of State College has a population of 40,195 (2022) with a median age of 21.5. The University brings in over half of this population.

CENTRE COUNTY

According to the 2020 census, Centre County's population stands at 162,264 with a projected growth rate of 0.26% annually.



Our Desire

It has been our plea before the Lord to see our community transformed and empowered by the Holy Spirit. We are open in allowing God to "stretch us" in advancing His Kingdom. The Challenge Ahead

Your Input

Over the last several congregational meetings we informed the congregration of GWC's strategic plan in advancing the Kingdom and asked for your input regarding the opportunities before us. These included the completion of the basement and elevator, as well as purchase of the adjacent property. After careful consideration, the congregation made a positive motion to move forward with caution.



Storm Clouds

We see dark storm clouds forming on the horizon. The Federal Reserve increased their base interest rate eight times since June 2022. There are expectations that additional increases will be implemented in order to get inflation under control. Some financial experts are predicting increased inflation through 2024 or beyond.

GWC's finances are good. Offering contributions are up and we are paying the bills! When establishing the budget in acquiring the building, we did not plan to be in the black for the first two years. We believe we are good stewards with what the Lord has provided by creatively cutting costs and living within our means (Acts 27). God has truly honored our commitment to advance His Kingdom.

Here is where our concern lies: Our loan with Northumberland Savings Bank has an initial interest rate of 4.25%. This rate is set for five years, and is scheduled to be adjusted in January of 2026. According to the terms of the loan, the new interest rate is determined by taking the benchmark rate (i.e., FHLB 5 year amortizing fixed rate) and adding 3%. Using the most recent benchmark rate of 4.511% (as of 5/19/2023), that would mean the new interest rate would be 7.511%, a notable 3.25+ points higher than the current interest rate.

If we were to renew our mortgage payment with today's rates (current FHLB + promissory note) there would be an adjustment to our monthly payment from \$6,500.00 to \$8,876.48. *This increase in the interest rate would cost us an additional \$140,000*+ to service the loan for five more years. This does not reflect any additional base rate hikes The Federal Reserve is considering.




As Elders, we would like to propose the following:

- Eliminate the debt on the church facility
- Secure funding to complete space for our children/youth ministry
- Acquire funds for future expansion

Reasoning

The reasonings behind elimination of the mortgage would allow us to use the extra monies to hire additional ministry staff, complete the classrooms for children/youth, and purchase property for future numerical growth at a much faster pace. Plus, it would eliminate the \$60,000 per year currently paid out in interest on the loan. Naturally, it will provide more monetary resources to develop discipleship and community outreach.

The Process

A Campaign

The process forward involves a proposal to create a \$1.5 million Capital Campaign. The campaign will kick off in June 2023 and will run for 29 months. Pledges of financial commitments of stocks, cash or other assets will be applied toward eliminating the debt. There will also be regular updates as to the progress of the Campaign via letters, emails and testimonies. We are excited to see God moving among us as we step out in faith.



Why Have a Campaign?

Biblical Support

In the Old Testament, when Nehemiah was called by the Lord to rebuild the wall, he went through the process of waiting for the Lord to mature his vision. Like Nehemiah, we too have waited on the Lord, and now we are ready to pursue the vision of eliminating the building debt to expand our current ministries. We acknowledge God is sovereign and it is our desire as His people to be an extension of His vision to our community and beyond. Philippians 2:13 says "For it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure." God has been working behind the scenes to prepare us in accordance with His timetable. As in Nehemiah's prayer, God is providing an opportunity for us to work alongside Him.



Application

- We observe how God works to mature our faith.
 We are image bearers. Genesis 1:27 tells us we are created in His image. The Hebrew word "image" is "tselem" translated, "His drawing" or "His representation." The symbolism is like tracing an image on paper. As His creation, God is drawing His character and likeness through the activities of our lives by allowing us to nurture our faith.
- We participate in an act of worship (with a cheerful heart).
 We are participating in the act of worship. Because God is first in our lives, we have a desire above all to obey His commands. He is our voice of authority and final word in all that we do. Through our generous giving we let God know He has first place in our lives. We give so His Kingdom may expand locally and globally.
- We connect with a form of sacrifice (2 Samuel 24:24). There are many blessings God has perfectly designed for us. Because each one of us is unique in our own way, God uses our talents and gifts proportionally to advance His Kingdom. When we give sacrificially according to what He has already given us, we fulfill our part in allowing God to bless us as we in turn bless others in His name.
